This is a very small and isolated congregation. We didn't tell them we were coming, and in fact, when we arrived, we realized we



were the only ones present from outside the congregation. After the brief ceremony, we had a short and sweet time with those who were there. The church dreams of new & ongoing ministry and outreach in their new facility; maybe we helped them devote themselves to that even more just by our "ministry of presence" that day as we all symbolically and prayerfully turned over of a few shovelfulls of soil where we pray the church will grow!
