WHAT DIFFERENCE HAS IT MADE?

On top of wars and rumors of wars, Jesus said that there would be earthquakes too before the end comes. And we have had more than our fair share of tremors lately! On March 16 at about 11:30 PM another very strong earthquake hit in the same area as "the big one" of March 2011. There was extreme shaking, causing one pastor friend to tell us, "we thought we were going to die." It set off a tsunami alert for part of the coastal area that had been devastated 11 years earlier, and people had to evacuate to higher ground until the alert was lifted five and a half hours later. Even then, and even until now, there are some who were terrorized and who refuse to return to their homes. There was some significant damage, including a bullet train that derailed and knocked the whole line out of service for a month, heaves and cracks in the Joban Expressway, and damaged roofs and broken dishes. Colleague Ken Lee and I went to greet our friends and to try to give some comfort to them, and our trip was very successful beyond our hopes,



especially at the Nozomi Center, the 2011 quake disaster response project in which we were deeply involved for many years, and which now, in addition to being a community center, is a church planting project overseen by our friends Woody and Laurie Lauer. We didn't give the Lauers much notice that we were coming, but they went ahead and planned a community luncheon and worship time. Ken cooked, and I preached. The Lauers had contacted their neighbors, passed out handbills in mailboxes and made phone calls. They expected about 20 people to show up at our impromptu gathering. Well, people began to show up, then more came, and then still more. We had about 45 people come! It seemed clear to me that Nozomi Center has a place in the hearts of the people and that they turned here, urgently needing a place of peaceful retreat and a word from the Lord to help them process the terror and hopelessness many were feeling. Ken always makes too much food, but we almost ran out this time! As the time together wound down, a group of kids could be seen running around outside, and heard too, with their playground voices ringing out. Others hung around for more conversations. I do believe it was a time of much needed healing. And yes, it continues to make a difference! Nozomi means "Hope!"

Here's a "hope-filled" factoid: Since the Great East Japan Earthquake 75 new churches (maybe 30 of these being house churches) have been started in the 2011 disaster area of NE Japan, notorious for its resistance to the Gospel!

Here's a "did you know?" Japan and Russia never concluded a peace treaty at the end of WWII. Russia occupies a group of islands claimed by Japan. Any hope of moving forward ended with the invasion of Ukraine.

Here's some advance notice: We, the Spalinks, hope to return for an extended visit to the USA beginning from mid-October. Stay tuned as we develop our schedule!
