Healt care



Proper and continuous medical attention ensures a more improved and personal relationship between doctors and patient. During the period between July and August 387 medical services where given: 286 medical consultations, 10 nutritional advisements, 16 in psychology, 31 ophthalmology patients, 31 in dentistry and 13 in orthodontics.

In this two-month period there were two significant lectures on sanitation and personal hygiene given at the Leonardo Pasquel School.

Nutritional Recovery and Education

A social co-investment project partially supported by a federal government institution called INDESOL, which combats malnutrition, takes place over the last three month. During this project we have been able to carry out various activities including the implementation of backyard gardens in homes in and around our areas of influence in Xalapa and Mahuixtlán, Veracruz



We have been able to provide 110 children with not only breakfast service but also lunches on working days. In the same way, 20 pregnant women have been benefited with food supplements, medical consultations and nutrition and food orientation workshops.



New doors have been opened through educational institutions in the community of Mahuixtlán, such as "Esperanza Conde School", which allows us to strengthen our work in that area.



In the corresponding bimester 4,467 breakfasts and 5,217 hot meals were served for the children at the soup kitchens of CANERI, PORTON COLORADO and MAHUIXTLAN. This has been made possible thanks to the loving support that each one of our donors gives us



School Reinforcement Workshop

On July 19, a ceremony of delivery of school supplies to 11 students benefited with a grant of teaching materials was made, which were acquired with a donation from the children of the Christian Reformed Church of Louverne. 
