Andy had the privilege of chaperoning a few of his students to a Student Leadership Conference held in Budapest, Hungary. There were 350 high school students from all over the globe worshipping and hearing from God's Word. As it wasn't always easy to get them to understand the concepts of teamwork, respect, sportsmanship, and why there is a deeper spiritual meaning behind those concepts. But this year, the returning players are becoming leaders of these things for the newcomers.

The most "explicit" chance to evangelize and plant seeds was probably Tim's opportunity to speak during an assembly during the spring last year. The topic was forgiveness, and Tim was able to share some of his past struggles to "fit in" when he was in school to the middle schoolers of HOPAC, and talk about the need for being forgiven and forgiving others. He was able to share the awesome story of God's complete and total forgiveness available for every one of them.

Perhaps where we've seen our greatest reward has been in our volunteer work with the Sala Sala Kids Club. Once a week, after school, local children come to HOPAC for an hour and a half of play time, Bible message and a snack. There are over 120 kids each week and it is a madhouse of chaos! But despite the language and cultural barriers, these kids are slowly finding their way into our hearts. We're learning their names and it's such a joy to see them come each week.

The end result is that she has become a volunteer for the BTGMI Chinese to find appropriate pictures that match the message of each day's devotion in the Chinese Today.
