Building Project in Full Swing at OPCRC

FUTURE GENERATIONS REMODELING PROJECT MAKING GREAT PROGRESS TOWARD THE GOAL

s summer continues and the fall season seems right around the corner, it's a good time to update the congregation on the progress of our church remodeling project. Many of our church ministries have been/will be affected by this project, but we are confident that, when completed, this project will contribute positively to these ministries and all the members of our church family. After meeting with Aspen for a briefing on the project, the Building Team has noted that the construction process is running smoothly.

The following progress has been made in construction:
Framing is almost complete in all areas of the church including stage, nurseries, bathrooms, and balcony; stone work has been completed in the sanctuary; windows are completed and awaiting stained glass inserts; plumbing walls for bathrooms, etc. are now

We offer Christian worship services, discipleship classes, individual counseling, vocational training, job preparation, Bible studies and more—all in order to show inmates and their families the love of Christ in a clear, tangible way. We work with incarcerated men and women, formerly incarcerated men and women and the families of people in prison. In all of our programs and ministries, we're seeking to point others to the unique, personal relationship with Jesus that completely changes lives.

August 13: Pastor Church Relations www.crcna.org/pcr

Pastor-Church Relations is a CRC ministry that provides programs of "healing and prevention" for ministers, staff, councils, and congregations. Our offerings enable PCR to provide these services to congregations.

August 20: Luke Society (Jalapa) | www.lukesociety.org

The Luke Society is an interdenominational Christian ministry that works internationally with indigenous medical professionals to bring healing and hope through Jesus Christ. We support and empower nationals as they serve the Lord among their own people within their own language and culture. In Jalapa, Mexico, Dr. Jose Luis Guererro connected with the Luke Society in 2002. Today, the ministry in Jalapa includes a health clinic, ministrires for education, skills training, nutrition and Bible studies.

Faith Formation Ministries is a CRC ministry that works and walks alongside congregations and their leaders as they carry out their callings in discipleship and faith formation, with an emphasis upon children, teens, and young adults. Prayer shawls are sent to men, women, and children who have lost loved ones or are suffering from various illnesses or difficult circumstances. They are sent to old and young, churched and unchurched; they are your family, your friends, your neighbors, and your co-workers. The one thing they have in common is that they desperately need to know that someone cares about them and that they are loved by our heavenly Father.

Included with each shawl are a praying hands charm and a handmade card telling them of Jesus' love for them. The recipients of the shawls and blankets are prayed for by the people making them. Our hope is that the shawls will bring comfort, and that when they are used, the people will feel covered by the prayers of God's people.

There are a couple of women from Orland CRC and Calvin CRC that faithfully knit and crochet these blankets and shawls. Without these wonderful servants of God, this ministry would not be possible. The need is often great, and they are always ready and willing to help. We want to thank all of you for taking the time and using your talents to advance this ministry. You are a light in a dark world to all the people who receive the shawls you so selflessly make.

Since its beginning, the ministry has sent over 480 shawls and blankets. We are so grateful to those of you who have donated funds to cover the cost of the charms and postage. framed and plumbed with those walls nearly complete; structural demo is complete; steel supports for roofing have been installed; new vestibule area foundation has been laid and rough framing is underway; HVAC new fan coil units and ductwork have been installed in the education wing; electrical rough-in continues; AVL rough wiring is complete, including stage and sound booth. Wi-fi cabling is being installed by our volunteers.

We hope that in the next few weeks, rough plumbing and rough carpentry will be completed, all HVAC RTU's will be installed on the roof, and rework of the second HVAC unit in the FLC will begin. Also, classroom ceilings will be re-installed and rough inspections will be taking place.

The Aspen Group and the Building Team would like to thank the volunteers for their outstanding work on the stone project, fan coil removal, stage framing, and masonry fill-ins – and many other projects that are happening even outside the main renovations.

The congregational loan phase is now being offered. If you are interested in the following, please stop by the church office or contact Bert Kamp to get the proper form for helping the church out with a loan.

- Minimum \$10,000
- Interest rate 2.50%, payable annually on December 31
- 3-,5-, or 7-year maturities

Please continue to pray for the project in general – for workers safety, continued progress, and that God and his Kingdom can be glorified through this project. Pray that our neighbors can see that something is happening here at OPCRC and that they can feel drawn in to check it out. Also, pray that we can be hospitable in that process.
