week, we stayed in the classroom to learn about trees changing colors and dropping their leaves and squirrels gathering nuts to prepare for winter. Then we ended the week by taking a field trip to the Lake Katherine Nature Preserve in Palos Heights. It was a great way to explore God's creation with hands-on learning.

We enjoyed a tour around the grounds which included a pond, a wooded trail, a waterfall, a butterfly garden, and an herb garden. It was interesting to see swans and fish in the lake, bugs underneath logs, and butterflies. In the herb garden we were invited to rub the leaves of herb plants with our fingers and then sniff our fingers to figure out what kind of plant we were touching. There were strong scents of lemon, mint, basil, lavender, and much more.

We were also able to spend some time indoors in the learning center doing activities in the program "I Spy Fall!" We made leaf rubbings, sorted seeds, picked corn kernels off the cob, measured many items gathered from the woods, and played a game of "sink or float" with items in a bucket of water. Our day ended in the area where live animals were housed. We were thrilled to observe turtles swimming, snakes in their tanks, a guinea pig, and a rabbit. Our tour guide said we were so well-behaved that she treated us to the opportunity to pet the rabbit while she held it. What a great day of exploring God's beautiful creation in the season of Fall!

The children listened intently as fire safety concepts were taught and demonstrated. Fire fighter and police officer puppets kept our interest as we learned about smoke detectors, the emergency number 9-1-1, and the safety tech-

Book Review: "No God but One"


In his book, No God but One: Allah or Jesus?, Nabeel Qureshi, a former Muslim, investigates the evidence for Islam and Christianity.

There are two main questions that Qureshi addresses in the book. Question 1: What are the differences between Islam and Christianity? Question 2: Can we know whether Islam or Christianity is true? To a Muslim, Allah refers to God who is not triune. To a Christian, God is three persons in one.

Qureshi goes on to compare Islam and Christianity in five different parts of his book:

Part 1: Sharia or the Gospel? Two different solutions. According to Islam, the way to paridise is Sharia, meaning, "the way," a code of laws to follow that will earn Allah's favor. Islam is the teaching of Muhammad, a prophet who has claimed to receive revelations from Allah. A prophet means a divinely appointed leader. Islam means submission. Muslims are required to proclaim the shahada, that is, "There is no God but Allah and Muhammad is his messenger." Christianity is also explained in part 1.

Part 2: Tawhid or the Trinity? Two different gods. Tawhid teaches that Allah is absolutely one, so he cannot have attributes. Most Muslims believe the Quran is eternal. despite the problem this creates for Tawhid, Islam's God is removed and non-relational.




Part 3: Muhammad or Jesus? Two different founders.

Part 4: The Quaran or the Bible? Two different scriptures.

Part 5: Jihad or the Crusades? Two different holy wars.
