BLASTING OFF TO A NEW PRESCHOOL YEAR!



Orland Park Christian Preschool is getting ready to begin a new school year. Our Monday/Wednesday/Friday class for 4-year-olds is full at 30 children. (DCFS of Illinois requirements state that our two classrooms are just large enough to have 15 children learning in each room at a time.) Our Tuesday/Thursday class for children who are 3 years old by September 1, 2018, has room for more children at the time of this writing. We are very grateful to God for the blessing of seeing the growth He has provided for the preschool over the last few years. The neighborhood community that our church is a part of is being reached as the number of children who are enrolled at our preschool from church families is about 25% while about 75% of our children are from families in our surrounding community. To God be the glory! This is His ministry.

The preschool staff is staying the same for the coming school year. We are so grateful for the love and faithfulness of these teachers as they serve the Lord by loving and teaching our preschool children! Please keep Ruth Baas, Lisa Cavanaugh, Brenda Harms, Janna Kuyvenhoven, Cindy Schipma, and Barb Vree in your prayers as they assist the children to grow in faith and learning throughout the school year.

The goal of Orland Park Christian Preschool is to offer a positive first-school experience that will nurture academic, social, and spiritual development in three-to five-year-old children. It is our joy to introduce these children to our great God and the world He has made. This fall our studies will be based on the theme of

outer space as we introduce the children to the school setting, help them meet new friends, and teach them to praise God for the marvelous world He has made. We will enjoy activities that help us learn about the sun, moon, stars, planets, rockets, astronauts, and much more! The areas of curriculum that we plan for by using the outer space theme are Bible, math, science, language, physical education, reading readiness, and fine motor development with creativity through arts and crafts.

On Wednesday and Thursday, September 5 and 6, we will hold our Family Visit days. Families of the students will be welcomed to explore our classrooms, meet each other, and gather all the information needed for a successful transition into the new school year. Our first days of class are Monday, September 10 and Tuesday, September 11.

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE CONFERENCE: TRINITY

Restorative Justice and Practice in a Fragmented World Conference [Editor: shorten title to Restorative Justice Conference if space requires], 9:00 a.m. - 3:40 p.m., Saturday, October 6, 2018; Ozinga Chapel, Trinity Christian College, 6601 West College Dr., Palos Heights, IL.

In our world, we experience social division, mistrust, and violence. One of the best new approaches to successfully counter these maladies in classrooms, juvenile justice courtrooms, and many other settings is called restorative justice. Trinity Christian College and Andrew Elliott Rusticus Foundation host our second conference on this faith-based perspective. We open with Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart's experiential keynote and close with an inspirational talk by school transformer Robert Spicer. Between them, we have a five-person panel and eight workshops from which to choose. They feature a judge, lawyers, crime victims, police officers, educators, and expert practitioners - all attempting to change attitudes and systems.

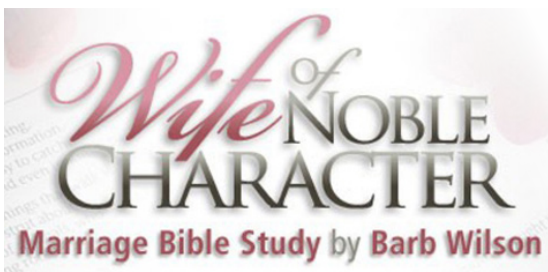

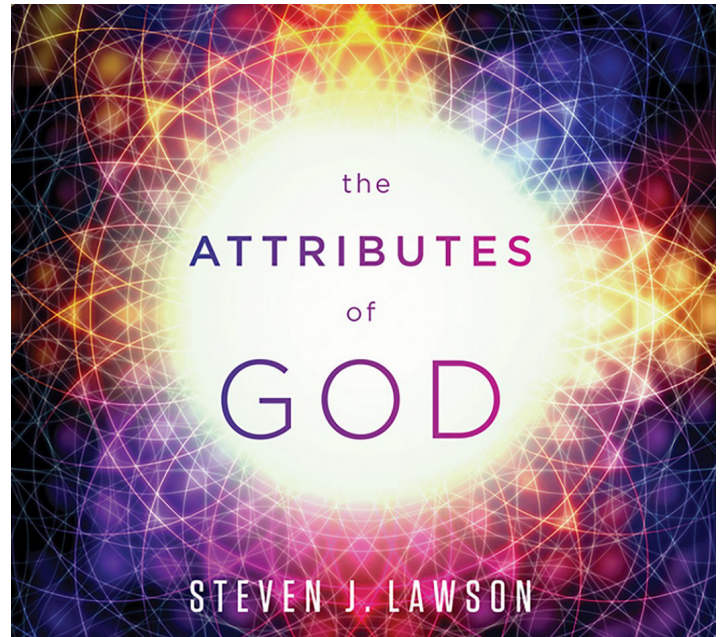
Do you know God? A.W. Tozer said “What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us.”
