Preschool News


DIVING INTO A NEW PRESCHOOL YEAR!

Book Review: "Uninvited"



In Uninvited - Living Loved When You Feel Less Than, Left Out, and Lonely, Lysa shares her own deeply personal experience of rejection, an incredibly painful childhood abandonment by her father.

Lysa honestly examines the roots of rejection as well as rejection's ability to poison relationships from the inside out, including our relationship with God. She suspects that honesty will always feel like a dangerous thing. However, honesty isn't trying to hurt me. It's trying to heal me, she says.

In her research, Lysa discovered two core fears that feed a person's sensitivity to rejection: the fear of being abandoned and the fear of losing one's identity. Old patterns of thought must be torn out, and a new way of looking at the core of who I am using God's truth has to be put into place. My identity must be anchored to who God is and who He is to me.

God's love isn't based on me...it's simply placed on me. And it's the place from which I should live loved. Lysa says that we should stop feeling left out. We can do this by believing that, even when we are overlooked by others, we are hand-picked by God. Overcome the two core fears that feed our insecurities by understanding the secret of belonging. Uninvited reminds us we



are destined for love that does not reject or uninvite.
